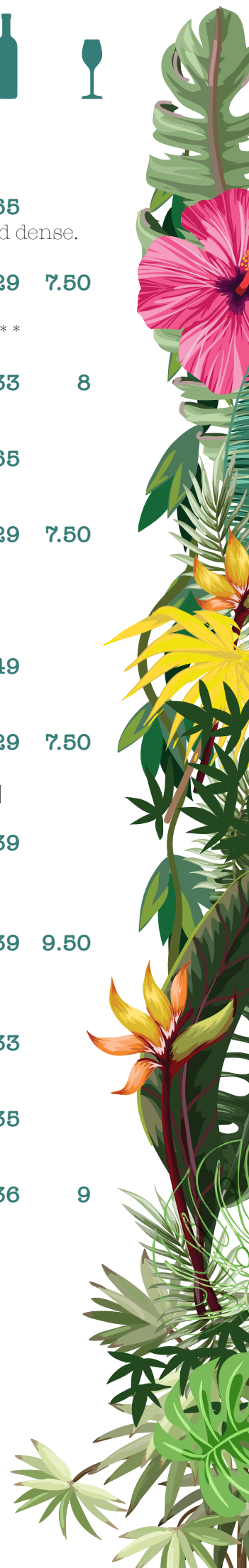

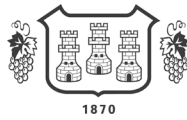

Beyond sustainability

We are proud to partner with 5th generation estate Familia Torres as part of our ambition towards a fully sustainable wine list. Torres have been at the heart of wine sustainability and climate action for over 30 years, focusing their efforts on reducing their carbon footprint, recovering ancestral varieties, promoting climate research, and implementing regenerative viticulture to store carbon in the soil.

Based in Penedès in Spain, Familia Torres also have vineyards in California and Chile. All of their estates are sustainably managed with regenerative agriculture and organic vineyard practices. Regenerative viticulture includes no tilling, planting wild crops between vine rows, composting, incorporating animals and eliminating herbicides and pesticides. This creates a healthy, vibrant soil which acts as a carbon sink and also removes CO₂ from the atmosphere.

In 2008, Torres' commitment to the environment was strengthened with the creation of the Torres & Earth programme, which works to raise awareness about the need to take climate action in the wine industry and society in general. Their objective is to reduce total CO₂ emissions to become a net zero emissions winery before 2040. They are also co-founders of International Wineries for Climate Action (IWCA) and are leading the way for the wine industry to hold itself accountable on climate change.

Some key sustainable initiatives at Familia Torres include:

- Commitment to net-zero carbon by 2040
- Renewable energy sources (solar, geothermic and biomass)
 - Biomass generators (for dead wood and cuttings)
 - No artificial chemicals
 - No artificial fertilisers
- Capture & re-use of CO₂ released from fermentation
- Regenerative agricultural practices = storing carbon in soil
 - Electric vehicles in vineyard and winery
 - Fair trade certification
